Report

Ski & Snowshoe Orienteering

Morgan Arboretum – March 4, 2018

Weather forecasts kept changing for a week. The evening before the meet we were ad-vised to expect a temperature of a little above freezing and warned of a 40% ‘chance’ of some snow flurries or light rain. Well, it snowed all right but a brief flurry it was not! Wet snow continued for most of the day. Klister on your ski base, or ideally, waxless skis, should have ensured a great outing for skiers.

Happily, post-race chatter was centred more on the enjoyment of the day, the winter edition of the Arbo map and the challenge of the courses. 56 took part / 34 ‘starts’.

An extra plus for the event was the participation of a number of Ontario ski-Orienteers. They were on their way to Craftsbury, Vermont where the World Masters Championships in Ski-Orienteering takes place all week long from March 5 until the 10th.

As a result, **Paul Lefebvre** (Ottawa O Club) topped a field of 10 in the **Long-3 Ski** event, edging **Francis Falardeau** (Ramblers)... 1:09:56 to 1:12:23. Both had made small route errors on the course. **Alin Duca** (Waterloo Region Stars) was nearly 5 minutes behind the lead for 3rd place and **Eric Lillie** (Ramblers) had one of his best events to place 4th, 11 minutes back of Lefebvre’s winning time.

Among the women on the **SKI-2** middle event, **Mary Ellen Connolly** (Ottawa) topped two others by very close margins. Her time: 0:54:17. **Anna Johansson** (Swe) was 3½ minutes behind and **Olga Rayda** (Ramblers) 5½ minutes back.

Two independent courses were set for those doing Orienteering with **snowshoes**

In the Longer (and somewhat more technical) **#2** course, **Andrew Rhodes** (Rams) had a fast 0:49:27. **Ian Silvester** was 2nd in 1:11:45. There were 4 competitors on the course.

in the teams class, amongst 8 starts, a close race developed for 1st place. **Denise OBriain** and son **Ryan** (10 yrs.) edged **J Auer** and **_Akizu** 01:13:35 / 1:16:36.
